Read Jude 1-2.

*loved, kept, called* – Let's dwell on the importance of each word.

*mercy, peace, love* – How is each word meaningful for you?

Read Jude 3-4.

What did Jude want to write about? What did he need to write about?

Why did he need to write about this?

Jude mentions 2 things the godless men do. How is each of the 2 an attack on the gospel?

Read Jude 5-7.

Jude 4-16 is very similar to 2 Peter 2.

What is Jude's overall point in verses 5-7?

What does each of the 3 examples teach you about the Lord's judgment?

Read Jude 8-10.

Why do you think they are called *dreamers*?

Why does sexual immorality *stain / defile / pollute flesh*?

What does Jude want to teach through the example of the archangel Michael?

What happens to people who act like irrational animals?

What 3 Old Testament accounts characterize the behavior of false teachers?

Why do you think Jude and 2 Peter 2 were written for us?
